Members favorably reported on their experience with the East Friesian wool samples. Columbia fiber had been distributed at September's meeting, members that had started

spinning it were also happy with this fiber. Three ounce bags were distributed to those who hadn't previously received the fiber.

Diane Tice, Sue Jones, Nicole Massenzio and Angela Mann attended the New York State Sheep and Wool Festival held October 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. All enjoyed themselves and showed off their purchases. Due to NYS attendance restrictions it was not as crowded as usual.

Wondering where to donate your knit or crocheted items? Many charities and churches collect these for distribution:

- Red Scarf Project collects red scarves for those aging out of the foster care system
- <u>Snuggles Project</u> collects 36" x 36" knit, crochet or sewn squares for rescue animals
- <u>Knitted Knockers</u> collects knit prosthetics for breast cancer survivors. You can drop off completed knockers at Knitty Gritty Yarns.
- Christina Tartaro will collect items at the November meeting for donation as needed to <u>Vera House</u>, the Department of Social Services, <u>Clear Path for</u> <u>Veterans</u> and <u>St Joseph the Worker Church</u>.

The meeting was then followed by Show and Tell with items placed in front of their maker for later close up viewing.
