SEPTEMBER MEETING

President Jill Robinson called the meeting to order at 10:25 AM.

She welcomed returning members and new members: Julia Abbott, Marcia Snyder, and Kiki Raymond, as well as several visitors.

Jill reminded everyone of name tags and the signup sheet for hostess and treats for the guild year.

The Treasurer's report is that our current balance is \$6,335.74.

Jill reminded everyone that dues are \$20 per year, due at the latest by the start of the November meeting. The October meeting will be on the fourth Saturday instead of the third because of the conflict with the New York State Sheep and Wool Festival.

Guild member State Fair competition winners were congratulated, including Nicole Massenzio, Angela Mann, Alicia Henn, and Elaine Salvetti.

Earlier in the year, the local knitting guild Twisted Stitches sent out feelers in regard to a bus trip to Rhinebeck. Per Christine Tartaro, interest appears to have waned. Some GFSS members suggested that they may have found, as we did earlier, that rising costs have made bus trips unfeasible.

There are still openings for demonstrators for the Zoo Fall Fest October 4th and 5th. A signup sheet was left out for interested parties.

We are confirmed for the Fiber Frolic at Beaver Lake Nature Center on April 18th, 2026. Insurance will not be required.

The Schweinfurth Museum is collecting hats, mittens, scarves, etc for their My Hands-Your Heart project. The deadline to donate is September 30th.

Marilee Williams brought up the suggestion that the guild support two exhibits at Art Rage in November, and in January and February. The first is of the extraordinary embroidery on traditional Palestinian garments and the second —250 Million Stitches—is to show work representing refugees throughout the world. After discussion, Laine Abernathy moved that we donate \$100 for each exhibit, totaling \$200. The motion was seconded and voted on. It passed with one opposed.

Nicole Massenzio, our program chair, reported on progress for two workshops. One, given by Terri Guerette, would be aimed at beginners. The second will involve dyeing by our own star dyer Sam Bova.

Our next breed experience will be Romney. Sam will be dyeing some of this for us also.

There was a general discussion about the State Fair experience this year and next year.

The meeting then ended to be replaced by a much happier sharing of Show and Tell, and a lovely luncheon.
